Goal

Pass the IBCLC exam on the first try.

Objectives

- 1. Recognize how early childhood growth/development and ongoing physiologic processes affect feeding, breastfeeding and lactation. Focus on initiation and continuation of milk production, milk ejection, and milk transfer.
- 2. Create a plan of care to support breastfeeding mothers and infant/children with pathological conditions from conception until age 2.
- 3. Within the IBCLC's scope of practice, choose strategies to safely promote initiation, continuation, and perhaps re-establishment of breastfeeding for couples who may be exposed to pharmacologic or toxicologic threats.
- 4. Adjust interaction with clients and colleagues to promote and support breastfeeding with diverse psychologic, social, and anthropologic beliefs and norms.
- 5. Prevent or solve problems related to milk supply, milk ejection, and milk transfer.
- 6. Select, use, and appraise the efficacy and impact of technology as it relates to breastfeeding initiation and continuation. Whether interacting with groups or individuals—clients or colleagues—employ a variety of communication techniques (including electronic communication) to promote and support breastfeeding.
- 7. Demonstrate compliance with legal and ethical imperatives for IBCLC daily practice.
- 8. Recognize the implications and advocate for promoting, supporting and protecting breastfeeding as a public health initiative.
- 9. Interpret research findings as they pertain to the clinical role.
