Psychology/Sociology/Antropology

- *baby blues:* common condition of new mothers in the early postpartum period, characterized by mood swings, unhappiness, irritability, sadness; onset typically during the first 2 to 3 weeks
- *baby-led weaning:* the approach of adding complementary foods to the baby's diet in a way that lets the baby self-feed when he is interested; typically, this involves soft foods at the family table
- cisgender: a person whose physical and behavioral gender matches their gender assigned at birth
- *co-bedding:* the arrangement in which the infant sleeps on the same sleeping surface, such as in a family bed
- *co-sleeping*: the arrangement in which the infant sleeps in close proximity to the mother, but not necessarily on the same surface
- *mother-led weaning:* the approach of adding complementary foods to the baby's diet when the mother decides; typically, this involves pureed baby foods and infant cereal
- *nursing strike:* a period of time when an infant who has otherwise been nursing well changes their behavior and refuses to breastfeed
- *postpartum depression:* condition of severe depression after delivery that interferes with daily functioning; onset may occur any time within the first year
- *postpartum psychosis:* condition of severe mental illness requiring prompt treatment and possibly hospitalization; onset typically occurs within the first 1 to 3 months
- *rooming-in:* the arrangement in which the infant sleeps in the mother's room instead of a nursery, typically on a separate sleeping surface
